# President's Report

Our junior competition continues to set new records. This year we had 183 teams. Friday afternoon/evenings at Nolan's Reserve is organised chaos. The atmosphere at the venue is just awesome. There are thousands of kids running around laughing and enjoying the great game of touch football. With over 2,000 of them playing touch football at MWTA, I believe we will continue to maintain our dominance in the junior representative teams for some years. This will continue to feed into our senior representative teams, and can only improve what are already very strong teams.

Our senior local park competitions continued to improve both on and off the field. There have been a number of improvements implemented by the club to help out with the running of the competitions. This is anything from line marking machinery, paint, sirens and witch's hats to better quality game touch footballs. While they may seem all small items, it all helps to build a better quality product for our members. We are looking at purchasing some other bigger items over the next 12 months to help keep MWTA the best touch football competition on the northern beaches.

Our junior representative teams were on track to record one of the most dominant years of Junior State Cup for MWTA on record. Before the Junior State Cup was abandoned on the Sunday morning due to the extreme wet weather, MWTA had shown enough for all to see that we were well on the way to blitzing the Club Championship again. I feel for all the kids that had trained so hard for the JSC weekend. Fingers crossed they all get to make amends next year.

Our senior representative teams were again very strong this year. At Senior State Cup, we had a lot more teams in grand finals and who became state cup champions than any other permit, but we somehow didn't win the Club Championship. I may not be a mathematical genius and I don't pretend to know how the Club Championship points are awarded, but I do believe we were clearly the most dominate club at Senior State Cup. We were again very competitive at Vawdon Cup. All of the teams, bar the men's premier league team, made the semi finals. The men's premier league performed really well, even though they didn't make the semi finals. They were in every game they played and the games they lost were only by 1 try all season. They are a team on the rise. I was devastated for the women's premier league team. They destroyed the tournament all year going through the round games and semi finals undefeated. They unfortunately had an off day on grand final day and lost. I look forward to watching them win Vawdon Cup this year.

This year saw Michelle Thomson Laing stand down from her position of Administration Manager. Michelle was instrumental to the success of the junior competition numbers we had received over the past few years. She was a valued member of the club and will be missed. We have been able to replace her with another fantastic member of the club in Jill Zochling. Already Jill has shown what a capable dedicated Administration Manager she will be. She has brought valuable attributes to the group that include organisation, attention to detail and dedication. I believe she will be a very valuable asset to our club.

Our representative season was also successful, with strong results across Vawdon Cup, Junior State Cup & Senior State Cup. Particular mention should go to Stuart Geros, our Junior Rep Director. Stuart had big boots to fill when taking over this position from Jenny Swain. He has done a wonderful job paving the way for future success across the junior ranks. Additional mention should also go to all our rep coaches, assistants and managers. MWTA is blessed to have such a highly skilled group across our representative ranks, which was reflected in our junior and senior, male and female success.

The Executive committee functioned well this year, achieving all goals we set out. Great work by our new President, Graham Knights, who led by example. Graham's commitment to the role and the club is second-to-none, and without doubt the club would not have had the success it did without his direction and commitment. The management committee met every 6 weeks throughout the year and function very well. Maintaining and managing an infrastructure the size of MWTA is not easy. # Treasurer's Report

We have had another good year at Manly Warringah Touch Association, with once again an increase in turnover and number of teams participating. Our financial figures have a few factors that can be misleading to our financial result, as stated last year with the overstated profit. Manly Warringah Touch Association's financial year is from January 1 to December 31<sup>st</sup>. The timing of the Junior State Cup requires us to pay out a lot of money before the end of our financial year, and it is not collected until all teams are finalised and levies are determined in the following financial year (this is also our calendar year). As the collection is done during the following year our reported profit is down considerably, which soon corrects itself within the next quarter. We also have seen an increase in the number of teams at Junior State Cup, which requires a larger outlay for accommodation deposits. Last year we took the approach to leave most expenses and income in the year that they occurred. It does not make any real difference to the actual profit/loss of Manly Warringah Touch Association, just additional work in modifying accounts, so we have retained that approach. The profit for last year was a loss of \$4090, however the following quarter we made a profit of \$29,446, which explains this unfortunate timing of our financial year. We have already paid a lot of deposits for next year's Junior State Cup.

Care Accounting at Narrabeen, who we have found to be extremely helpful and professional, does all our accounting (happy to pass on their number if you're looking for an accountant). Also, due to our turnover, we are required to have all our accounts audited externally. Our turnover continues to increase in both local and representative competitions, which we keep separate so one does not pay for the other.

This year has also seen a number of increases in cost to run the competition such as lighting and NSW touch affiliation fees (which includes our insurances). Also NSW Touch has eliminated its discount for increasing your overall numbers, which gave us a great saving last year. Manly Warringah Touch Association management decided to leave summer competition fees the same as last year, even with these increases, to bring our income closer in line with our expenditures.

Manly Warringah Touch Association is in a very stable position, and hope to remain this way, whilst providing a great competition for both the local and representative teams.

# Senior Representative Director's Report – Anthony Dudeck

## Vawdon Cup 2014

MWTA entered a record number of 6 teams at the NSWTA 2014 Vawdon Cup. We had success in a Grand Final title win for the Women's Division 2 with a tense drop-off victory 4-3 against Campbelltown. The Men's Premier League put on an improved season. Whilst they may have only just missed the semi finals, they were in every game they played and only lost games by 1 touch down. The men's Division 1 team stepped up this season from Division 3. They showed huge improvement and made the semi final series. A new men's team played was entered into Vawdon Cup this season. A team made of all of our up and coming junior players was entered into the Division 4. They had an awesome first year making the semi final series. The Women's Premier League and Division 1 both reached the Grand Final but were both runners up with the Canterbury Bulldogs defeating the Sea Eagles 3-2 in Premier League and in Division One the Wallsend Wolves got the win over the Sea Eagles 5-3.

# Junior Representative Director's Report— Stuart Geros

We had many records achieved this year for our Junior Representative teams, starting with a fantastic number of players who trialled for our rep teams, making it very hard for our selectors. As a result we entered 14 representative teams at the NSW Junior State Cup, with two teams in each of the 12 and 14 boys and girls age groups.

Our first tournament was at the Central Coast Touch Football Championships in December, where all our teams performed well and Manly won the Club Championship. We followed up with some more great results at both the Parramatta Gala Evening and the Scorpions Tournament, hosted by Manly.

Our 190 players all turned up at Port Macquarie in February for what we hoped was going to be the best ever NSW Junior State Cup for Manly. The kids were all smiles and despite the deluge of rain, there was excitement on the faces of everyone in the Manly tent. This is what Manly is about, and why we are such a great club.

By Saturday evening, every age group, both boys and girls, were in the first two teams in their pool. The quality of play that our teams were demonstrating, in the conditions, was outstanding. It really was an awesome display and a credit to the coaches and managers who had schooled our teams so well.

By Saturday evening, the club was marching towards what would have been a phenomenal day of touch football for the Sunday finals. Then came the news early Sunday morning that the championships had to be abandoned. The fields had nearly as much water on them as the eyes of our players, coaches and parents did, when the news came out. It was truly devastating and nobody was prepared for it.

There was much reflection of what could have been. The positive was that we remain the defending State Champion Club for another year.

As a result of our great results at Junior State Cup, Manly had an impressive number of players selected to play for the Sydney Scorpions at the NSW Regional Championships. Held at Penrith in April, the Scorpions were crowned as NSW Champions with Manly players and coaches achieving great results.

Manly's junior club is recognised as a nursery for some of the best senior touch players in the world, as recently advertised at the Senior World Cup in Coffs Harbour, where many Manly players were crowned World Champions representing Australia. I would like to congratulate all those players involved. It's not just about what happens on the field for Manly, but what happens off the field. The way that our young players are taught to conduct themselves and the respect that they show their opposition and the referees is just as important as the way that we play on the field. All year I received many comments from parents and coaches of other clubs at the various tournaments, wondering how we have become such a great club and wanting to be a part of the Manly culture.

This reputation starts with our tireless committee, who have put so much effort into our junior teams this year. I would like to thank the committee for the fantastic support that they have provided the Junior Club. I would also like to recognise the efforts of the team of people who supported the committee, the coaches and managers who do such a wonderful job with our teams and the sub-committees who supported our preparations for State Cup with accommodation and uniforms. # Development Director's Report– Brandon McDonald

## SENIORS

We started the year with the women having three sides in Vawdon Cup finals, with the Women's Open's moving one step closer and making the final, Division 1 narrowly missing out and Division 2 winning the competition. The women have also been working on a development group in the lead up to the new rep season in 2015. I would also imagine they will also enter a Youth team this year in Vawdon Cup.

In the men's, our successful Men's Division 3 side went straight to 1<sup>st</sup> division, with a mixture of young players from Div 3 last year and some fresh faces coming back to Vawdon Cup to help in the development of these players moving forward. This also makes that pathway into Men's Premier League an easier step for the next generation of players. We also entered a Youth team that ended up playing 4<sup>th</sup> Division Men's and made the semi's, which proved to be a great step for the younger players moving into Open Men's touch.

The 2015 State Cup was another great weekend, with our 20's Women's team winning the tournament and our 20's Men's team with the best result since 2008. The boys are on the move!!!

We have also represented well at State and Australian levels this year with some new faces in our senior ranks. Some junior women's players have also made the step into the senior State and Australian ranks, proving the ongoing commitment and cohesion made at club level by the players and coaching staff is really working and paying off.



## JUNIORS

This year we saw another jump in the number of our local junior park competition teams and the park touch at the junior level is growing stronger every year.

Initiating a "Coach the Coaches" programme has helped develop touch at this level and will be something that will be worked on again this junior touch season.

This also had a roll-on effect to our Junior Rep trials, with a big jump in numbers in the 12 and 14 age groups at the trials, really giving us something to think about for the upcoming junior comp.

The cohesion between the coaches has really helped the boys get closer to the level of the girls. It was an unfortunate end (due to a washout) to this year's Junior State Cup for everyone, especially with the boys looking at their best in years and the girls still performing at the highest level.

We have also represented well at Junior Scorpions this year, with a number of players making State Merit Teams, and also making these sides at a young age.

A number of players also represented at State and Australian levels!!!

We have also seen a rise in our refereeing ranks at junior level, with some junior refs making it in the big time ranks of the sport.

I would also like to take the opportunity to thank all the people involved at the junior and senior levels. With a growing number of players, the job is getting bigger every year!!! From the men on the BBQ to competition directors, we have had exceptional help to make this all happen.

We are currently working on Expression of Interests surveys for Men's and Women's upcoming Vawdon Cup and we have also started work on a revised development programme for our juniors. # Referee Director's Report– Caren Friend

The strong growth of competition within MWTA has again seen an increase in demand for referees. This demand is easily met in our Junior Competition, where children are lining up to earn a bit of pocket money. The benefits of this are more confident children, who can communicate effectively and make decisions, while staying fit. There was a total of 50 children and adults put through their Level 1 Referee Course in 2014/15, ensuring a never-ending supply of Referees for our hugely successful Friday night Junior Competition. All of our Junior Competition still maintains a “badged” Referee on every game, as do most of our Senior Competitions.

Unfortunately for MWTA, our very strong and successful Representative Player bank does not carry through to our Referees. At this point I would like to add that the small band of Representative Referees is of the highest calibre and quality. This season has seen the selection by Touch Football Australia of both Tony Suters and Luke Saldern for the Federation of International Touch World Cup played in Coffs Harbour in April/May, as well as receiving their Level 6 Referee Badge Upgrades at the recent National Touch League Championships. This is an achievement never seen before in the history of Manly Warringah Touch Association. Caren Friend achieved her Level 4 State Grading. In recognition of this achievement Caren will be presented with her Blue Blazer by NSWTA at the upcoming NSWTA Referee dinner. The majority of our Senior Representative Referees achieved appointment to “Finals” at both State and National Tournaments.

The demand for Referees in our Senior Competition has again required some of our Representative Players stepping in to assist. Some of these players (Scott Collins, Steve Huckle, Greg Friend, Charlie Suters, Tom Suters, Jason Martin, Jarvis Zochling, Joel Marsters, Gloria Berryman, and Aaliyah Paki) now regularly pick up a whistle to referee. Unfortunately it is the same faces we see time and time again. This does not allow for the growth of our Referee ranks, but instead produces a “bandaid” solution, especially for Representative duties. The first step in relieving some of this, we hope, may be seen through the re-introduction of the “duty” Referee. Although only in its infancy, we have already gained an additional fulltime Referee (as opposed to a player Referee) and have seen some fantastic refereeing being done. All “duty” Referees have attended a Level 1 Referee Course, compliments of MWTA, which is in line with the MWTA Referee Panel's goal of having a “badged” Referee on every game.
